






SUBJECT FEATURE Physical Education

Physical Education (PE) promotes learning with enjoyment through developmentally appropriate movement experiences based on core values.

The PE program starts in kindergarten and builds students' athletic abilities by fostering broadbased physical competencies and opportunities. The program focuses on fundamental motor skills and movement concepts and offers various sports activities until primary and secondary school.















Upper Primary has sports and games that teach concepts like 'using space' and 'advancing teacher-structured bases' in game situations. The Secondary curriculum offers swimming lessons and water games like Water Polo and Water Tagging to learn water survival skills, three strokes, cardiovascular endurance, and stroke skills refinement. The PE department emphasizes building students' character in sports by putting the school's core values into action.

The long wait is over! Its been four years since the last Science Fair and this academic year, it has its comeback.
